The Teaching as Research (TAR) Fellows Program gives TAMU graduate students & postdoctoral scholars the opportunity to conduct a research project on learning and teaching methods in a real classroom in collaboration with a faculty mentor in their discipline. In this year long program, students design, implement, assess and report on innovative teaching methods tested in a classroom here at Texas A&M.

TAR Project Milestones and Requirements:

Requirements for All Projects

Attend Summer, Fall, & Spring LC Meetings

- 4 slide summary presentation by Sept 1st

IRB Training

- Submit certificate of completion

IRB Proposal Submission

- Submit copy of Approval (\$200 partial payment of stipend)

Complete TAR Project

- IRB must be approved prior to starting the project reach the Scholar Level

Complete Pre- and Post-Surveys

Requirements based on CIRTL Certificate Levels

Practitioner

- Final reflection & 1-page report
- Additional \$200; Total stipend = \$400

Scholar

- Final reflection & oral or poster presentation
- Additional \$550; Total stipend = \$750
- Final reflection & submit manuscript for publication in peer-reviewed journal
- Additional \$800; Total Stipend = \$1,000

NOTE: Maximum stipend for TAR Fellows is \$1,000 depending on milestones achieved. Only full-time graduate students are eligible for the stipend.
